Immunisation Catch-Up Template

For children/adolescents currently aged from 14 years up to 16 years [<16 years]

with NO documented history of vaccination

<u>Important information</u> This catch-up template covers funded vaccines only.

- Sources for checking vaccination records: AIR records; VIVAS records; Personal Health Record Book; patient records; previous service
 provider please ensure you access all available information prior to vaccinating the patient.
- Meningococcal ACWY vaccine is funded for Year 10 students and for all adolescents aged 15 to <20 years.

GARDASIL 9

- Gardasil 9 [HPV 9 vaccine] is funded for those aged up to 20 years who missed the school immunisation program (SIP). If Gardasil 9 is commenced in adolescents <20 years, completion of the course is funded.
- This template provides advice for HPV9 spacing for two age groups: those aged ≤14 years [i.e. < 15 years] and those aged ≥15 years.
 NOTE: Adolescents with specific immunocompromising conditions require a 3-dose course given at 0, 2, 6 months. For more detailed information on HPV9 recommendations refer to the summary tables.
- AIR is gradually being updated with historical records, so it is recommended you check both AIR and VIVAS for vaccination history of adolescents
 before vaccinating. The service provider (not the parent) can contact the public health unit for SIP records. Sources for checking vaccination
 records: AIR records; VIVAS records; Personal Health Record Book; patient records or previous service provider prior to vaccinating the patient.

Do not use:

- Infanrix-Hexa; Infanrix-IPV, Infanrix/Tripacel and Menitorix vaccines are not registered for people aged ≥10 years.
- Priorix-Tetra and ProQuad (combination MMRV vaccines) are no longer funded for >10 years.

Tips

• A 2-dose hepatitis B [adult] vaccine course, given 4 months apart, is registered for those aged 11 to 15 years providing the course can be completed before their 16th birthday otherwise use a 3-dose hepatitis B (paediatric) vaccine course given at either 0, 1, 4 months or 0, 2, 4 months spacing.

Refer to the <u>electronic</u> version of the Australian Immunisation Handbook (AIH) for further details **Note:** If these vaccines are started at different times, ensure the minimum spacing between vaccines containing the same antigen/s is adhered to.
