Immunisation Catch-Up Template

For children currently aged from 4 years up to 10 years (<10 years)

with **NO** documented history of vaccination

<u>Important information</u> This catch-up template covers funded vaccines only.

- Do not use: this template if child has turned 10years
- If a child has a **DOB** on or after **01/10/2014** to be considered up to date they will need to receive Infanrix or Tripacel [DTPa] booster dose scheduled at 18 months. In a catch-up program Infanrix or Tripacel always need to be given a minimum of **6 months** spacing from any other diphtheria, tetanus or pertussis [DTPa] containing vaccine.
- Influenza vaccine is funded for all children from 6 months up to 5 years of age and all Indigenous children up to 15 yrs of age. The first year a child under 9 years receives influenza vaccine, 2 doses are given at least one month apart. Thereafter 1 dose annually.
- Sources for checking vaccination records: AIR records; VIVAS records; Personal Health Record Book; patient records; previous service provider please ensure you access all available information prior to vaccinating the patient.

Refer to the <u>electronic</u> version of the Australian Immunisation Handbook (AIH) for the 'Minimum acceptable dose Intervals for children <10 years'.

Note: If these vaccines are started at different times, ensure the minimum spacing between vaccines containing the same antigen/s is adhered to.

Contact the Central Queensland Public Health Unit for advice on the extra vaccines recommended for:

- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children
- Premature [<32 weeks gestation] and/or low birth weight [<2000g] children
- Children identified as being at medical risk for invasive pneumococcal disease [IPD]. Refer to the Pneumococcal section of the Australian Immunisation Handbook 10th ed. [AIH] for a list of conditions associated with an increased risk of IPD.

Refer to the Immunisation Schedule QLD [Children under 10 years] 1 April 2019 for scheduled 'additional' vaccines for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and children identified as being at medical risk for IPD.
