To provide alternative models of primary care for RACH in regional and remote areas that continue to be unable to source GP workforce through the development of innovative local solutions.

Description of Activity *

Review areas facing the greatest challenges in sourcing a GP in Residential Aged Care Homes in the region, through analysis of existing data, including regular CCQ engagement data.

Facilitate collaborative problem definition (ie. Needs analysis) and solution identification through GP/ACCHS' and RACH stakeholder summits across the region, with a focus on areas of highest need in relation to low primary care servicing levels for RACH residents.

Continue engagement with relevant stakeholders through CCQs existing stakeholder engagement mechanisms, particularly through the 3x Aged Care Collectives in Central Queensland, Wide Bay and Sunshine Coast which bring together a key group of stakeholders to support localised, achievable system improvements in order to enable access to appropriate, safe and quality care for RACH residents.

Engage with identified residential aged care homes, GPs, and Nurse Practitioners to determine appropriate locally workable models.

Commission services to provide primary care access to residents in areas of higher need in alignment with needs analysis and solution identification including nurse practitioner models.

Commission an evaluation partner to evaluate the patient, organisation and system level outcomes, the effectiveness of the model overall and the potential for scalability.

To provide consistent general practice support to residents in aged care facilities understanding barriers and enablers.

Description of Activity *

The GPACI Initiative aims to enhance continuity and quality of care for residents in Residential Aged Care Homes (RACHs) by fostering connections between residents and General Practitioners (GPs), general practices, or Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Services (ACCHS). The program addresses healthcare access gaps, with a particular focus on rural and underserved regions, promoting equitable access to regular, consistent, and high-quality medical care for aged care residents.

The initiative seeks to strengthen care partnerships between healthcare providers and aged care facilities to overcome barriers that limit residents’ access to GP care. By addressing these challenges, the program aims to reduce delayed diagnoses, prevent deterioration of chronic conditions, and improve overall health outcomes for aged care residents.

Planned Activities:

Provide General Practices and RACHs with information on GPACI and its benefits

Support General Practices to participate in GPACI and provide them with resources and training to uplift their GPACI capability in consultation with the National MyMedicare PHN Implementation team

Consultation: Engage with General Practices, RACHs, Multi-Disciplinary Teams (MDTs), and Aboriginal Medical Services (AMSS) to identify barriers, enablers affecting care delivery.

Codesign: Collaborate with GPs and RACHs to assist with coordination of care and identify locally workable solutions

Work in partnership with ACCHS to co-design culturally safe and appropriate pathways for First Nations residents who request care from within the PHN region.

Consider innovative care models and provide recommendations for future healthcare improvements.

Practice/RACH Support: regular communication and engagement activities with General Practices, RACHs, MDTs, and AMSS to strengthen relationships, improve collaboration, and ensure timely and consistent healthcare delivery.

Utilise existing CCQ engagement mechanisms, including aged care collectives, newsletters and face to face RACH/practice engagement to support collaborative learning, networking, share local innovations, case studies, and best practice approaches to delivering GP care in RACHs.

Description of Activity *

In collaboration with the Queensland (QLD) Primary Health Network (PHN) Collective, QLD Health, and the Commonwealth, Country to Coast QLD (CCQ) has identified an opportunity to improve the management and treatment of cardiac risk factors across QLD.

This project aims to use Primary Sense™ and its ability to deliver patient-specific clinical decision support to enable early intervention, improving the treatment of cardiovascular disease (CVD) in primary care and to subsequently reduce the demand and cost to Queensland's hospital and health services.

The Preventing Heart Attacks and Stroke Events through Surveillance (PHASES) with Primary Sense™ project seeks to undertake a proactive approach to address this challenge by leveraging the data sharing and data analytics capability of the Primary Sense™ tool, the Primary Health Insights™ platform, and the Johns Hopkins ACG® System (i.e. contemporary digital health capabilities) to deliver patient-specific, clinical decision support enabled surveillance and intervention, improving the treatment of cardiovascular

disease in primary care.

By leveraging these tools and capabilities to manage care using the reviewed and published 'CVD Policy Model', benefits across ambulance, hospital emergency departments, inpatient and rehabilitation services are estimated at \$1.3 billion dollars over five years. Furthermore, with these tools and capabilities in place other benefits and use cases relating to high-risk patients and their subsequent high health service utilisation can also be explored.

CCQ and the QLD PHN Collective are proposing to undertake a state-wide implementation of Primary Sense™ and the Johns Hopkin ACG® System, conduct a public health campaign across QLD over 2 years, and then transition to an ongoing support and maintenance model (including license fees) for subsequent years.

Request pages will also be updated in consultation with the local HHSs. These updates may include updated referral forms, specialist details, contact and location details, and new services. Service mapping of public and private providers is conducted when required to capture changes to existing providers and new services. Consultation will continue to be conducted across the care sector to identify gaps and opportunities to further develop new and enhanced models of care for clinical pathways to meet evolving needs of the community and changing evidence-based care.

Engagement, awareness and education activities will also be undertaken to improve uptake and monitor feedback. CCQ will leverage its Clinical Societies, Aged Care and Dementia networks, Practice visits by Primary Health Coordinators and HealthPathways employees, Healthy Ageing Coordinator visits to RACFs, Information in GP matters newsletters, attendance at

local seniors' events, and Learning Management System (LMS) HealthPathways promotional videos to promote the use and benefits of referral pathways and any changes to referral pathways to keep the sector involved and informed in referral pathways. The HealthPathways videos will contain testimonials from front end users and clinical editors and will be accessible from the HealthPathways platforms.

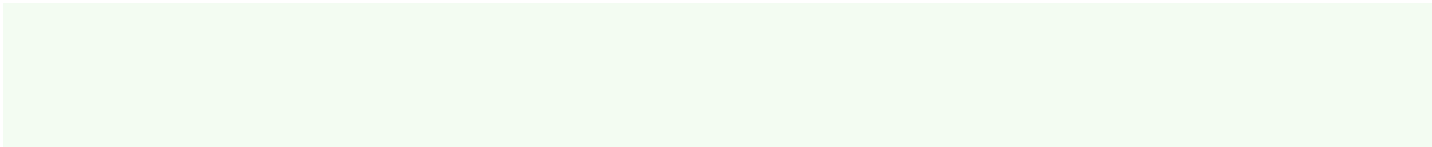

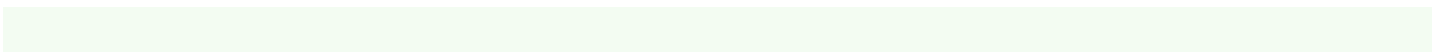
