In the 2023-24 May Budget, the Australian Government announced \$358.5 million over five years from 2022-23 to establish 58

Medicare UCCs in identified communities; including Bundaberg and Rockhampton in the CCQ region.

CCQ determined geographic placement of Urgent Care Centres in Rockhampton and Bundaberg, informed by data from Queensland Health category 4 and 5 Emergency department presentations including patient access flows to from their place of residence. Financial projections for urgent care centre MBS billing was modelled extrapolating Category 4 and 5 presentations to inform sustainability planning.

CCQ will commission Urgent Care Centres in accordance with program guidelines through an EOI open general practices located in the target regions, followed by a Request for Tender from suitable applicants. CCQ will codesign the model of care, engaging with the preferred provider, local hospital and health services, Queensland ambulance, local General Practices and Aboriginal medical services, medical imaging services, pathology services and the local community.

Once the Urgent Care Centres commence service delivery, codesign process will be ongoing and iterative, refining the model of delivery in response to challenges and opportunities informed by qualitative and quantitative datasets.
